# Selenski homicide trial is on

## Judge rejects call for delay until Feb. 2013

WILKES-BARRE — Hugo Selenski's double homicide trial will begin in 52 days.

Luzerne County Judge Fred Pierantoni loudly banged his gavel seconds after he denied a request by attorneys Shelley Centini and Edward Rymsza to continue Selenski's trial to February 2013.

Centini pleaded with Pierantoni for nearly an hour Thursday, claiming she could not be "competent" or "effective" in defending Selenski if the trial was not continued from Sept. 10. Centini and Rymsza were appointed to defend Selenski in January.

A third attorney on Selenski's defense team, David Lampman, recently resigned.

Pierantoni used Centini's own words in her request to postpone the trial as his reason to keep to the schedule.

"Mr. Selenski has the benefit of two capital homicide-certified attorneys," Pierantoni said before referring to Centini's pledge that she will continue to protect Selenski's rights at whatever cost.

Assistant District Attorneys Sam Sanguedolce, Jarrett Ferentino and Michael Melnick and county Detective Gary Capitano are prohibited from pub-

# Buyouts raise hopes, challenges

Jenkins Township resident Joe Cernera is on pins and needles waiting for the buyout of his flood-prone property.

"I want to get out of here so bad. I love it here, but I can't go through this again," said Cernera, who has dealt with eight floods in 60 years at his River Road home.

Township Supervisor Stanley Rovinski is thrilled Cernera and at least 66 other township property owners are expected to get a

fresh start on higher ground, but the resulting demolition will create a new concern because municipalities must own and maintain the cleared lots left behind.

The land must remain undeveloped, and the township already has several playgrounds and athletic fields, Rovinski said.

"We don't really need another

park," he said.

At least for humans. He wants to explore the possibility of a dog park similar to ones in Wilkes-Barre and Hazleton.

A citizen suggested a golf driving range, he said.

"That's a great idea. We'll find something useful," he said.

Rovinski expects a sizeable void from buyouts in the Miller Street section known as "The Patch," which still contains several structures off foundations from September flooding. A few buyouts are expected in Cernera

ra's neighborhood, which offers front-porch view of the Susquehanna River.

Cernera said the site could be a scenic rest spot with some walking paths and benches if enough connecting lots are cleared. The layout of vacant space will be up in the air until buyout negotiations wrap up this fall because impacted property owners have the right to back out of sales up to closing day, officials say.

# Airport parking spaces go empty

Drillers' changing fortunes blamed for decline in parking, passengers last month.

PITTSTON TWP. — The Wilkes-Barre/Scranton International Airport has more parking but fewer passengers.

Airport officials tied both to Marcellus Shale natural gas drilling. Industry workers — many from out of state — filled the parking lot and garage with vehicles as drilling increased in recent years and the airport responded with a \$533,146 project that added 143 parking spaces.

A dedication ceremony for the parking expansion was held Thursday, before an airport board meeting at which it was reported the passenger count in June was 8.2 percent below June 2011.

Barry J. Centini, the airport's director, blamed the natural gas industry for the decline in parking lot — and overall airport — use. He said the low price of natural gas has caused companies drilling in the Marcellus Shale formation in the state's Northern Tier to slow down production and limit the number of new wells drilled.

State and federal data support his view.

In Wyoming County, according to Department of Environmental Protection, 105 well permits were issued in 2011. This year only seven have been issued and none since Feb. 16. In Columbia County, there were six permits issued last year, none this year.

The price of natural gas in April was \$1.89 per thousand cubic feet. In April 2011, the price was \$4.05. A high of \$10.36 was registered in June 2008.

In June, 13,757 vehicles used the airport's lots, a 9 percent decrease compared to June 2011. From May to June, parking was down 11 percent, although the year-to-date total through June

# Computer hacker mom literally made the grade

## Police: Access used to change kids' marks

Most parents would do anything to help their children succeed in school, but one Weisenberg Township mother took it too far, Lehigh County authorities say.

Catherine Venusto, a former Northwestern Lehigh School District employee, used her knowledge of the district's computer system — and the superintendent's password — to change her children's grades, state police said.

Her daughter went from a failing grade to a medical exception, according to court records, and her son went from a grade of 98 percent to an even more impressive 99 percent.

When state police detectives interviewed Venusto, 45, at her home last Thursday, she admitted changing the grades and also admitted using the superintendent's password to gain access to district emails and personnel files, according to court records.

Venusto said she logged on to the district's computer system, even after she had left her

job as a secretary for the district, out of "curiosity and boredom," according to court records.

On Wednesday, Venusto's curiosity got her charged with three counts each of unlawful use of a computer and computer trespassing, all third-degree felonies. She was arraigned before District Judge Robert C. Hall and released on \$30,000 unsecured bail.

Authorities say Venusto used the superintendent's information from Aug. 23, 2010, to February 2012 to gain access to the district's human resources system, which contained thousands of files associated with district

# Ex-PSU board chairman resigns

An internal investigation by former FBI Director Louis Freeh found that Garban was briefed twice about developments in the Sandusky case but didn't share what he knew with the entire board, depriving trustees of a chance to prepare for the worst crisis in Penn State's 157-year history.

The former chairman of the Penn State board of trustees resigned on Thursday, becoming the first board member to do so in the wake of the Jerry Sandusky child sex abuse scandal.

Steve Garban was harshly criticized over his handling of the crisis that engulfed Penn State after Sandusky's arrest last November, and he faced persistent calls from alumni and fellow board members to step down.

After the report's release, trustees accepted responsibility for a failure of oversight and said they were "deeply ashamed." Board Chairwoman Karen Peetz, who announced Garban's resignation in a letter on the board's website, said

at the time that no trustee would step down, however.

Incumbent trustee Anne Riley lost re-election last spring as alumni upset over the board's handling of the crisis picked three new trustees — all of whom campaigned on a reform platform — to sit on the 32-member panel.

A 1959 Penn State graduate, Garban worked at the university for 33 years, the last 12 as treasurer and senior vice president of finance and operations. Alumni first elected him to the board of trustees in 1998, and he began his fifth three-year term in 2010.

Some trustees felt he was too close to ousted university president Graham Spanier, according to the Freeh report.

In April 2011, the report said, Spanier told Garban about a grand jury investigation of Sandusky. Garban, in turn, failed to alert fellow board members. Garban told investigators that Spanier downplayed the Sandusky probe, and he recalled his former boss saying, "It was the third or fourth grand jury and nothing would come of it," the report said.

Then, on Oct. 28, Garban learned from Penn State's chief lawyer that two university administrators were about to be charged with failing to report suspected child abuse. Garban told investigators he was "astounded" when he saw Sandusky in the Nittany Lion Club at Penn State's home game against Illinois on Oct. 29. Yet he

informed only two other trustees — James Broadhurst and John Surma — that charges against Sandusky, Athletic Director Tim Curley and Vice President Gary Schultz were imminent.

Garban stepped down as board chairman three days after Sandusky's Nov. 5 arrest, handing the job to Surma, the vice chairman. One day later, the board ousted revered football coach Joe Paterno and Spanier.

Meeting in Scranton last week, trustees were privately furious that Garban, Broadhurst and Surma failed to warn them about the impending scandal, a trustee told The Associated Press, speaking on condition of anonymity to discuss sensitive board matters.

## Emmys again take shine to cable

**"Mad Men" and "Girls" help cement cable lead over network programming.**

**LOS ANGELES** — "Mad Men" is on the brink of making Emmy drama series history, Lena Dunham's comedy "Girls" is the buzz du jour, and both are on cable. As Thursday's nominations proved, the gap between cable and the broadcast networks is stunningly wide and only getting wider.

Five out of six best drama series slots were claimed by cable shows, both premium and basic, with the sixth going to PBS. Networks, which had controlled the comedy genre last year, lost fully half of that turf to "Girls," "Veep" and "Curb Your Enthusiasm," all HBO.

Not a single actor in a network drama series earned a lead or supporting bid for September's Emmy Awards.

Cable channels offer so much awards-caliber programming that even theatrical films, increasingly dependent on action films and adolescent comedies, can look shabby in comparison.

"A lot of what's happening on cable TV, you'd be hard-pressed to see that happen in a studio film," said Don Cheadle, whose performance in Showtime's "House of Lies" earned him a best comedy actor bid. "Right now, one of the most difficult things to put together are movies which have interesting content and adult themes."

For writers and actors who want to pursue creative work,

that leaves independent films or the expanding number of cable channels willing to invest in ambitious scripted projects.

Lena Dunham, who made a splash with her indie film "Tiny Furniture," breathed life into the TV sitcom with "Girls," a darkly comedic coming-of-age New York story on HBO. It received a best comedy nod and acting, writing and directing nominations for her.

She described the experience of debuting the much-buzzed about "Girls" as "this feeling of finding your audience in this incredibly clear, beautiful way and being shocked that people were connecting to what I was doing and being amazed by the level of debate it was starting."

"Girls" is HBO's "current spin on 'Sex and the City,' which was a strong past Emmy favorite," said Tom O'Neil, editor of the Gold Derby awards website. He called Dunham the current "toast of Hollywood."

History Channel moved into scripted fare in a big way (after backing away from airing the controversial "The Kennedys") with its "Hatfields & McCoy," starring Kevin Costner, which earned solid reviews and spectacular ratings this spring and 16 nods Thursday.

The miniseries was the most-watched entertainment telecast ever on basic cable, drawing about 13 million each for its first two parts and hitting a high of 14.3 million for its third chapter. The best the networks had to offer that week: NBC's "America's Got Talent," seen by 11.5 million people.

Networks increasingly rely on talent contests and sports, programming that invites live viewing and means fewer people will record the airings and skip commercials.

Scripted series, whether drama or comedy, tend to be formulaic — which certainly doesn't mean unpopular. CBS is the most-watched network on the strength of crime dramas including "NCIS," "CSI" and their spin-offs.

But innovation is coming from shows like "Mad Men," which earned a leading 17 Emmy nominations and the chance to earn its fifth best drama award and set a new record as the most-honored drama in television history.

The shows it's currently tied with and could leave behind: the broadcast dramas "Hill Street Blues," "L.A. Law" and "The West Wing," which once represented the best of TV.

"I always use 'L.A. Law' as an example," said "Mad Men" creator Matthew Weiner. "If you went to pitch 'L.A. Law' to NBC right now, you'd end up on Showtime."

But he said he's hesitant to talk about the broadcast vs. cable dynamic.

"It's because, in the end, I think people should remember that the same companies are making both products, and really it's a diversification business-wise," he said. "If you are in the business of Viacom, you are making 'Homeland' and you are making 'The Mentalist.'"

"There is always room to take a risk when you don't have to deliver 25 million people, and that's an unfair advantage," Weiner said.

The Emmy ceremony will air Sept. 23 with Jimmy Kimmel as host.

## Brace appeals pay denial

Former Luzerne County Chief Deputy Clerk Bill Brace has appealed a federal judge's ruling that upheld the county's denial of Brace's

pension based on his guilty plea to a corruption charge.

Brace's attorney, Carl Poveromo, appealed U.S. District Judge A. Richard Caputo's ruling to the Third Circuit Court of

Appeals.

Caputo in June dismissed a federal lawsuit Brace filed against the retirement board, which denied him his pension based on his guilty plea in 2010 to corrupt receipt of a reward for official action. Prosecutors said Brace accepted a tailor-made suit in exchange for helping a company obtain a county contract.

Caputo ruled the offense triggered the state's pension forfeiture act, which precludes a public official from receiving a pension if they are convicted of a crime related to the employment.

Poveromo is challenging Caputo's interpretation of the act, and the judge's ruling that Brace was not entitled to a hearing before the retirement board acted to deny his pension.

## W-B Twp. fire chief guilty of DUI

John Yuknavich's attorney likely will appeal, claims traffic stop illegal.

WILKES-BARRE — Wilkes-Barre Township Fire Chief John Yuknavich was convicted Thursday of a drunken-driving charge lodged after police stopped his vehicle while investigating allegations he violated a protection-from-abuse order.

Senior Luzerne County Judge Joseph Augello rendered the verdict after a brief non-jury trial. Yuknavich was immediately sentenced to 48 hours in the Luzerne County Correctional Facility.

Barry Dyller, Yuknavich's attorney, had attempted to get evidence in the case suppressed, arguing the traffic stop that led to the charges was illegal.

Yuknavich, 48, of East Northampton

Street, was charged in November with two counts of driving under the influence and one count of careless driving after a police officer stopped him near the Plains Township home of Denise Pavlick, who had obtained a protection-from-abuse order against him.

A blood test showed Yuknavich had a blood alcohol level of 0.162 percent, double the legal limit of .08 percent. Pavlick had called police to report Yuknavich drove past her home and revved the engine of his car. Yuknavich was charged with violating the PFA, but the case was later dismissed because the order did not specifically prohibit him from being near her home.

Dyller argued that, at the time of the traf-

fic stop, police did not have sufficient evidence to support the allegation he had violated the PFA, therefore the stop was illegal.

Assistant District Attorney Tom Hogans maintained the officer only needed to have a "reasonable suspicion" that Yuknavich had committed the offense. In the alternate, Hogans said the police officer witnessed Yuknavich speeding and driving carelessly after the officer began following him to question him about the PFA matter.

In his ruling, Augello noted the officer had not determined if there was a PFA violation. He nonetheless denied the suppression motion, finding police had sufficient evidence to stop Yuknavich based on the driving violations. Dyller advised Augello he will likely appeal the ruling on the suppression motion. Yuknavich did not wish to seek bail pending resolution of that matter, however, and opted to be immediately

sentenced.

The conviction means Yuknavich will face suspension of his driving license by the state Department of Transportation. Dyller said he does not believe that suspension will impact Yuknavich's position with the fire department.

"He won't be able to drive a fire truck, but it won't affect his ability to serve the department," Dyller said.

In addition to the prison sentence, Augello ordered Yuknavich to pay \$525 in fines, \$307 in restitution and to undergo a drug-and-alcohol evaluation. He was directed to report to the county prison on Aug. 10 to serve the sentence.

Yuknavich is also facing separate theft charges for allegedly stealing nearly \$11,865 from the fire department and using its credit card to make \$3,706 in personal purchases. That case remains pending in county court.

## State to look for 'ghost riders'

LCTA board member also says he was told supervisor groped female driver; no comment from officials.

The state Department of Transportation will look into allegations that county bus drivers padded senior citizen ridership numbers with "ghost riders" to increase government funding.

PennDOT spokeswoman Erin Waters said on Thursday that department officials were aware of allegations of rider-padding that a county councilman made publicly on Tuesday, and she was researching information on the state funding formula for public transit systems as it relates to ridership.

A Luzerne County Transportation

Authority board member also said former board members told him a female bus driver was groped by a supervisor last year and the supervisor received a two-day suspension followed by a week-long suspension after the supervisor had a confrontation related to the incident.

On the alleged ghost riders, Luzerne County Councilman Edward Brominski told fellow council members during Tuesday's council meeting that the information came to light because drivers allegedly stopped marking nonexistent riders when they became disgruntled about the authority's installation of cameras in their buses, which they viewed as invasive.

He said the ghost riders were allegedly logged as senior citizens because they present cards that don't have to be swiped by drivers. Other riders feed

money into a box or present bus passes purchased in advance.

Brominski said two bus drivers, a passenger and both a present and former authority board member discussed the allegation with him. At least one of these individuals asked the Federal Bureau of Investigation and another government entity to investigate, he said.

On Thursday, LCTA board member Patrick Conway confirmed he spoke to Brominski after "a couple former board members (and) a couple bus drivers" told him of the allegations.

Conway, who was appointed to the board in November, said he was told that authority Executive Director Stanley Strelish directed drivers to pad the senior citizen numbers.

Strelish has vehemently denied bus

People will be able to sign up at tonight's meeting and the next steps to be taken will be determined.

"It's basically informational at this point," Rittenhouse said.

The Plymouth Crime Watch is reforming and will hold an informational meeting at 7 p.m. today at the Goodwill Hose Co. No. 2, 451 W. Main St., Plymouth.

Borough Police Chief Myles Collins and Mayor Dorothy Petrosky are scheduled to attend the meeting along with Charlotte Raup and members of the Wilkes-Barre Crime Watch.

"She offered to help us," said Rittenhouse of Raup.

Raupe said the Wilkes-Barre group has been in existence for 30 years and acts as "eyes and ears of the police" throughout the city.

**WILKES-BARRE** – A city official said Thursday a special panel will be created to review the contract with LAG Towing Inc., whose owner has come under fire for his fees and record keeping.

Council last week left it up to Mayor Tom Leighton to act on its request for the review.

"The mayor's going to accept council's recommendation to form some type of committee," said Drew McLaughlin, city administrative coordinator.

Still to be determined are who will sit on the committee and its time frame to conduct the review, said McLaughlin.

The mayor also plans to discuss with each of the five council members their concerns on the issue, said McLaughlin.

Council voted 3 to 1 during its July 12 meeting to recommend

the creation of a panel consisting of members of council and the administration and outside experts to review the contract, focusing on performance and severability.

The lone dissenter, Councilman Tony George, failed to gather support for his call to end the contract. He accused LAG owner Leo Glodzik of price gouging and failing to respond to the city's request for receipts of towed vehicles.

George said Thursday he made his position "very clear" last week. "I have not changed my position," he said.

He said the paperwork and documents he collected on LAG were handed over to council President Mike Merritt.

At the council meeting, Leighton stated his commitment to LAG, saying there was no reason to terminate the contract and that the complaints received by the city were acted on.

Glodzik said last week he welcomed a review by the panel if the mayor decided to go that route.

## U.S. Orthodox Church leader quits amid claims

**Questions about whether he failed to report allegations of rape, other sexual misdeeds.**

GARDEN CITY, N.Y. — The leader of the Orthodox Church in America has resigned and been replaced amid questions about whether he failed to report to church officials or law enforcement an allegation of a rape by a

priest and other sexual-misconduct claims.

The church issued a statement saying Metropolitan Jonah, the archbishop of Washington, submitted his resignation in a letter on July 6. The letter from Jonah noted the resignation had come at the request of the Holy Synod of Bishops. Jonah did not refer to the rape allegation in his letter.

Part of the letter to the bishops said he begged "forgiveness for however I have offended you, and for whatever difficulties have arisen from my own inadequacies

and mistakes in judgment."

There was no telephone listing for Jonah, who couldn't be reached for comment on Thursday.

The church, based in Syosset, on Monday issued a three-page statement detailing Jonah's four-year tenure as its leader. It said Jonah had failed to report a 2010 rape allegation involving an unidentified priest to authorities when he learned of it last February.

It said for several years there had been a repeated pattern of Jonah "taking other unilateral actions that were contrary to the advice of the Holy Synod and/or the church's lawyers."

## FEMA penalizing Shickshinny for insufficient flood insurance

**Feds allocating \$56,000 for repair of municipal building instead of \$300,000 sought.**

SHICKSHINNY – Borough Secretary/Treasurer Melissa Weber had more bad news on Wednesday evening when she informed council the Federal Emergency Management Agency is penalizing the borough be-

cause it didn't have enough flood insurance coverage on its municipal building.

During a discussion on repairs to the structure, Weber said she was told by FEMA officials that \$56,000 rather than \$300,000 for repair work was being allocated.

She said she was told Shickshinny is being penalized nearly \$250,000 for failing to have enough flood insurance.

At present, Weber said, council has cumulative contractor bids of \$52,000 to repair the

structure and there is a need to move ahead with restoration.

Councilman Mike Steeber responded angrily and said that after the flooding of 1972, the borough received \$15 million in federal recovery funds. He said a substantial amount of that was used to erect the municipal building according to prevailing federal specifications.

"Then the feds raised the dikes in the Wilkes-Barre, condemning us to more severe flooding," Steeber said, "and

now they're making it tougher for us because another set of regulations that they want to shove down our throats."

After a brief debate, it was decided that Weber, with the assistance of attorney Jeff Malak, would appeal FEMA's decision.

Council decided to compromise on paving on the Vine Street project in order to utilize funding for the installation of 170 feet pipe for surface water drainage.

Council also approved adver-

tising the vacating of borough property to accommodate a pending project by the First Keystone Bank, which has proposed locating a branch office in the Hasay building along Main Street.

Weber also discussed the possibility of merging services, such as police and public works, with Salem Township to save money on insurance, payroll taxes and workers' compensation.

She said a merger was discussed during a recent meeting that in-

cluded Malak and Matt Dominas of the state Department of Community and Economic Development, and she was bringing it to council's attention in order to facilitate further discussion.

She said Dominas wants to schedule more meetings on the subject of a merger.

Steeber said, however, this matter was discussed in the past but went nowhere because of issues associated with finances and command.

## Six are killed in crash

## Corbett faults PSU admin

## Monsignor seeks probation

The first U.S. church official convicted of endangering children in the priest-abuse scandal asked Thursday for a probationary sentence, saying he had already experienced months of scrutiny, vilification and shame.

Monsignor William Lynn, 61, of Philadelphia awaits sentencing on Tuesday.

Lynn, the former secretary for clergy at the city's Roman Catholic archdiocese, handled priest assignments and child sexual-assault complaints from 1992 to 2004.

He faces up to seven years in prison after a jury convicted him last month of felony child endangerment for his oversight of now-defrocked priest Edward Avery. Avery is serving a 2 1/2 to five-year term after pleading guilty before trial to sexually assaulting an altar boy in church.

# Syria's president turns up on TV

**Appearance comes one day after a bombing killed some top regime officials.**

BEIRUT — Syrian President Bashar Assad made his first appearance Thursday since a bomb killed some of his top lieutenants, looking calm and composed on state TV even as his forces turned parts of Damascus into combat zones and rebels seized two of the country's border crossings.

The unprecedented attack on Assad's inner circle Wednesday, along with the government's inability to crush the rebels after five days of intense clashes in the Syrian capital, point to an unraveling of his grip on power

after 16 months of violence. "It is a war going on here, literally a war," said a 25-year-old woman in the Muhajereen neighborhood. The sounds of battle had kept her up all night and she stayed home from work because she feared random gunfire, she added.

Even though Assad's powerful military remains mostly loyal — suggesting a total collapse may not be imminent — the rebels appeared to be making startling gains as the civil war intensified.

Besides the fighting in Damascus, rebels took over a Syrian border crossing near the Iraqi town of Qaim, said Iraqi army Brig. General Qassim al-Dulaimi. Fighting at a Syrian army outpost near the Syrian-Iraq border killed 21 Syrian soldiers, he added.

In addition, amateur video posted online showed rebels taking over the Bab al-Hawa border crossing with Turkey, where they stomped on portraits of Assad. The Associated Press could not independently verify the video because the

government bars most media from working independently in the country.

A diplomatic solution to ending the bloodshed seemed even more remote after Russia and China again vetoed a Western-backed U.N. resolution aimed at pressuring Assad's government to end the escalating conflict.

Analysts said the regime was clearly shaken by the violence in the heart of its power base of Damascus, but the next step was not clear yet.

"We should not get carried away with speculating about the impending fall of the regime," said Salman Shaikh, director of the Brookings Doha Center and an analyst on regional politics. He said the regime's forces "are still showing a certain amount of cohesiveness in battle."

# Obama stays on attack in Fla.

WASHINGTON — President Barack Obama is trying to keep the pressure on Republican rival Mitt Romney, opening two days of campaigning in Florida in search of military veterans, seniors and unaligned voters in the state's crucial mid-section. Romney's wife said no more of her husband's tax information would be made public.

Obama was appearing Thursday in Jacksonville and West Palm Beach as his campaign urges Romney to release more years of his tax returns and keeps a sharp focus on the former Massachusetts governor's tenure as the head of a private equity firm.

Meanwhile, a New York Times/CBS poll released Thursday shows Mitt Romney's support at 47 percent of registered voters, with President Barack Obama at 46 percent. A Fox News poll has Obama at 45 percent and Romney at 41 percent. Both results are within the poll's margins

of error and show very little movement from surveys taken earlier in the summer.

"We've given all that people need to know and understand about our financial situation and about how we live our life," Ann Romney told ABC News in an interview broadcast Thursday.

Florida is the largest and most coveted of the nation's Election Day toss-up states, a place where Romney could severely damage Obama's chances of winning re-election. Republicans are holding their national convention in Tampa in August in hopes of giving themselves an edge in the state.

Yet, if Obama can lock down Florida's 29 electoral votes, it would be difficult for Romney to mount enough support elsewhere to capture the White House.

Polls have shown Obama and Romney in a dead heat in the state, which has struggled with an unemployment rate of 8.6 percent. Florida provided the deciding margin in George W. Bush's victory in 2000 and the state has been closely con-

tested ever since. Obama carried it in 2008.

Obama has repeatedly criticized Romney's private equity firm, Bain Capital, arguing that it promoted the outsourcing of jobs to countries like China and India. And Democrats want Romney to make public past tax returns, noting that the one year for which he has released returns showed investments and offshore accounts in Switzerland and the Cayman Islands.

Several Republicans have joined in the call for more transparency, including several GOP senators and Texas Gov. Rick Perry, who challenged Romney for the GOP nomination earlier this year.

In an interview aired Thursday on WTOL-TV in Toledo, Ohio, Romney said one reason not to release more of his returns was that "the Democratic Party and the opposition has all these people that comb through and try and find anything they can to distract from the issues people care about, oftentimes in a dishonest way."

## Father turns down Disney trip for daughter

TOLEDO, Ohio — A 4-year-old girl who went through two years of cancer treatments isn't being allowed to go on a Make-A-Wish trip to Disney World because her father said she's in remission and the trips should go to children who are sicker than his daughter.

The young girl, McKenna May of Haskins, had the trip postponed twice while was undergoing treatment for leukemia and finally was set to go in August when the father refused to sign off on the trip, the girl's mother and grandmother said Thursday.

The family said Make-A-Wish requires signatures from both parents if either have visitation rights or is listed on the birth certificate. McKenna's parents never married or lived together. Her grandmother said the father only recently received visitation priv-

ileges.

McKenna's mother and grandmother are now collecting donations at local businesses to pay for the trip to Disney on their own. Money has poured in since their story spread beyond northwest Ohio. They haven't told McKenna why the Make-A-Wish trip was canceled.

## Stalled farm bill gains new urgency

Widespread drought puts more pressure on House to agree to compromise.

WASHINGTON — As record drought conditions continue to plague farmers and send corn prices higher, some lawmakers are pressing House leaders to bring the now-stalled farm bill to the floor.

The House Agriculture Committee approved the once-every-five-years legislation earlier this month, but there have been indications that House leaders wouldn't bring the legislation to the floor before the election. House Speaker John Boehner, R-Ohio, dislikes key parts of the bill, and many members of his party object to its massive farm subsidies. The bill also cuts \$16 billion from food stamp programs, which is sure to spark a bitter battle with Democrats.

But as dry weather continues to hurt farmers, some say the bill can't wait. Led by Reps. Kristi Noem, R-S.D., and Peter Welch, D-Vt., a bipartisan group of 38 Republicans and 24 Democrats sent a letter Thursday asking that House leaders "make this legislation a priority."

The House bill and a bill passed by the Senate earlier this year contain beefed-up crop insurance programs that would protect farmers from losses like those being caused by the drought conditions.

"What do we do? We need to pass a farm bill," Sen. Debbie Stabenow, a Michigan Democrat who chairs the Senate Agriculture Committee, said Thursday morning in an appearance on MSNBC.

"The speaker needs to bring it up on the floor," Stabenow said. "And frankly, we need to add some additional disaster assistance for 2012 as part of that. We've got to get this done."

The bill that passed the Senate in May contains many of the controversial subsidies and cuts food stamps by \$4.5 billion. The chamber has been waiting for the House to act on its version of the legislation before the two chambers meet to craft a compromise bill.

Stabenow said the Senate is unwilling to accept the deeper cuts to food stamps contained in the House bill, but that it might be possible to meet "in the middle."

"If the House gives us a bill, we'll negotiate," Stabenow said. "We'll come together in the middle. But the House has to act so we can do that."

The drought is believed to be the worst since 1956.

# 2nd DUI test tossed in fatality

Onix Gorbea-Lespai is facing trial in connection with vehicular homicide charge.

WILKES-BARRE — Prosecutors are prohibited from using a second blood test with alcohol results against Onix Gorbea-Lespai, who is facing a vehicular homicide charge.

Luzerne County Judge Lisa Gelb on Wednesday granted a request by attorney Demetrius Fannick to throw out a second blood test given to Gorbea-Lespai, 50, after he allegedly struck and killed 18-year-old Kayla Bahrey, of McAdoo, on Interstate 81 on July 3, 2011.

State police at Hazleton allege Gorbea-Lespai, of Mechanicsburg, had a blood alcohol level of .084 percent after he struck Bahrey along the interstate as she stood outside a disabled vehicle.

Tyler Paisley, of Hazleton, was sitting inside the disabled vehicle and was injured in the crash.

A handcuffed Gorbea-Lespai was taken by state police to Hazleton General Hospital for a blood test. He was advised of his rights and consented to blood being drawn from his arm, according to court records.

Before taking Gorbea-Lespai to the state police barracks, a trooper was instructed to return Gorbea-Lespai to the hospital for a second blood test. Fannick argued Gorbea-Lespai was not advised of his rights before consenting to the second test.

Gelb ruled the second blood test was not for medical purposes and Gorbea-Lespai was not given a choice to refuse the second test.

Gorbea-Lespai's trial is scheduled to begin on Aug. 6 on charges of homicide by vehicle while driving under the influence, aggravated assault by vehicle and two counts of driving under the influence.

UNION TWP. — Contract negotiations between the Northwest Area Education Association and the school board are continuing, with the cost of health insurance being one of the major areas of dispute.

Board Chairman Randy Tomasacci said at Wednesday night's school board meeting that "teacher contract issues" were discussed at an executive session before the regular board meeting and, he said afterward, "They're supposed to present us with some proposals (on Thursday)."

The education association has been without a contract for more than a year. According to reports, a major obstacle in ongoing talks has been a refusal by the NAEA for teachers to pay a portion of the cost of health insurance.

A coinciding issue involves attempts by the school board to disassociate with the Northeast Pennsylvania Health Care Trust in an effort to reduce costs. The board provided notice to the trust that such disassociation has been scheduled for the 2013-14 school year. But Tomasacci said this action hasn't met with acceptance from the NAEA.

Tomasacci added there is language in the previous collective bargaining agreement stipulating coverage shall be equal or superior to that which presently exists. Any change effected by the board could face a legal challenge from the teachers union.

In June, the district paid a monthly premium of more than \$189,000 to the trust.

In other discussion, Director Alton Farver contended a parking lot project performed at the Huntington Township school by Jeremy Kishbaugh Contracting was not "done right." Farver said that through an inspection he conducted while filling a pothole on the lot, he discovered the base was deficient. He said specifications called for 8 inches of shale, but he found areas where only 3 inches existed.

Farver said Kishbaugh's bid was \$3,500, and the company was awarded the job by Chris Parnell of buildings and grounds.

In reaction to this situation, Tomasacci said a new policy has been instituted whereby project bids are to be reviewed by Superintendent Ron Gerverra and then presented to the board for approval. Director Pete Lanza added, "The good ol' boy network is no more."

Tomasacci said the district will be as transparent as possible; no projects in the future will be executed without board consent.

The board approved a series of summer employment opportunities and awarded a contract to J.P. Mascaro for trash removal and recycling at a yearly cost of \$22,220.

It also moved to solicit bids for the purchase of a radio system to give district officials the ability to communicate with all student buses, starting with the 2012-13 term.

# Improvements for downtown Nanticoke unveiled

NANTICOKE — Mayor Joseph Dougherty on Wednesday night presented to City Council proposed renovations for the city's downtown area.

Daryl Pawlush of Penn Eastern Engineering detailed the street-scape project, which will make improvements to Kosciuszko, Prospect, Union, Main and Market streets. Planned improve-

ments include new sidewalks, curbs, ramps, trees and street lights.

Thirty parking spaces also will be added to the area, increasing the total to 58. Handicapped-accessible ramps also will be installed at the intersections. The project will bring new landscaping and sidewalks near the entrance to Weis Markets.

Pawlush said the new lights will utilize LED technology, which will cut down on the energy used, saving the city a considerable amount of money yearly.

According to the state website, The Financially Distressed Municipalities Act, also known as Act 47, empowers the state Department of Community and Economic Development to declare certain municipalities as financially distressed.

It provides for the restructuring of debt, limits the ability to obtain government funding, authorizes municipalities to participate in federal debt adjustment actions and bankruptcy actions, and provides for consolidation or merger of contiguous municipalities to relieve financial distress.

Heard said she has been working with the appointed recovery plan coordinator, and the city could be out of Act 47 status by the end of 2013 or early 2014.

"I'd like to be out of Act 47 tomorrow," Dougherty said. "We have an exit plan in place, and the city is in pretty good shape. We just have to watch our finances."

Dougherty said the city, like

several other municipalities, has been having difficulty collecting its earned income tax revenue.

"We'll get by," he said.

Nanticoke's annual general fund budget is \$4.2 million and the city has 56 employees. Two-thirds of the budget goes to the city's paid fire and police departments, Heard said.

Heard is a native of Exeter. She graduated from Wyoming Area High School and The University of Scranton with a degree in accounting. She is a certified public accountant.

"We have a wonderful staff here," Heard said. "They have been invaluable, helping out tremendously while we are short-staffed."

### Kirby fumbles on film decision

#### THE KIRBY CENTER PSU FILM FACTS

By canceling today's planned screening of a short film about the late Joe Paterno, Luzerne County's pre-eminent arts venue not only let down ticketholders, but also disappointed people who value free expression.

Called "The Joe We Know," the hour-long documentary that debuted earlier this year in State College apparently became too hot for an area audience to handle. At least, that seems to be the judgment of decision-makers at the F.M. Kirby Center for the Performing Arts in Wilkes-Barre. They pulled the plug on the film about a week ago, issuing the news announcement Monday.

"We felt it was really the most sensitive decision," said Marilyn Santarelli, the Kirby's executive director.

Sensitive, we wonder, or safe?

A public backlash against all things Penn State, especially Paterno, took hold after last week's release of the Freeh report, which faulted the former head football coach and certain university administrators for failing to act to prevent a pedophile in their midst from abusing new victims. The report – produced at the request of, and paid for by, the university's trustees – was not based on sworn testimony. It probably won't be the last word in defining Paterno's legacy, much less in getting to the bottom of what went so wrong on the State College campus.

Nevertheless, lots of people

stamped to distance themselves from anything connected to Paterno (from a statue near the football stadium to an ice cream flavor), and Kirby Center staffers bolted, too. Tsk tsk.

"The Joe We Know," based on interviews with former Nittany Lion football players, pays tribute to Paterno's impact on many of the young men he coached. The film was completed three days after the coach died in late January. It was screened privately by his widow, Sue Paterno, on her birthday: Feb 14, Valentine's Day.

It is an incomplete portrait of a man. It is one side of a multifaceted story.

Paterno's supporters as well as detractors should have been able to attend the Kirby Center's showing and draw their own conclusions. If so compelled, objectors should have picketed outside the venue. The arts, after all, can be messy, eliciting wide-ranging emotions.

At its best, the arts are bold. The arts can be thought-provoking, controversial, even challenging. The arts – or so we frequently hear when asked to donate to arts organizations – are intended to stimulate discussion and promote understanding.

In this case at the Kirby Center, there was no discussion. Only silence.

### Boy Scouts take intolerant path

THE BOY SCOUTS of America, an organization once known mainly for welcoming boys to a world of adventure, self-sufficiency and good citizenship, now is more famous for the groups of people it bans: atheists, agnostics and homosexuals.

### Natural gas industry monopolizes tax breaks

State Secretary of Revenue Dan Meuser recently characterized the Royal Dutch Shell ethane cracker plant proposed for southwestern Pennsylvania as potentially igniting a "new industrial revolution." Because of this, Meuser argues, Shell should be exempted from paying billions of dollars in taxes over the next two decades.

As Meuser makes clear, the proposed Pennsylvania Resource Manufacturing Tax Credit applies only to a plant that buys natural gas containing ethane, which essentially means that Royal Dutch Shell will receive substantial financial benefits that are not afforded to other industries in Pennsylvania. Because construction of the cracker plant is slated for an area that has Keystone Opportunity Zone (KOZ) design-

nation, Shell already is positioned to reap associated tax benefits. Thus, Shell will have the option to bestow its excess of tax incentives by selling PRM credits to gas-drilling companies.

Is it really necessary for Pennsylvanians to finance the extraction, transportation and processing of natural gas? The growth of this industry undoubtedly will be accompanied by serious environmental and health-related problems. Addressing these problems will require much money. At some time, Pennsylvania lawmakers will need to impose some sort of taxation to finance environmental restoration. This, of course, will outrage the anti-tax movement, thus renewing the political cycle that creates opportunities for people who represent multinational companies such as Royal Dutch Shell to attain positions of power. This is how the "1 percent" plays the game.

Meuser points out that, in order to attract an industry such as the Shell plant, Pennsylvania must compete against other states that offer similar tax incentives. This is not the only type of state-versus-state competition that has helped to pave the way for the natural gas industry. Because many aspects of the industry involve dangerous activities, states are encouraged to seek out the least stringent environmental safeguards. This is the reason why unconventional gas drilling has been exempted from compliance with federal water standards. The notorious "Halliburton loophole," politically engineered by Vice President Dick Cheney in 2005, is another example of how the "1 percent" plays the game.

Pennsylvania, as well as the rest of the world, does not need a new industrial revolution that is based upon the extraction and burning of fossil fuels.

What we need is an energy revolution – an acknowledgment that the quality of life for our children, and their children, depends upon the willingness of our leaders to confront ongoing problems that are a direct result of a fossil fuel-based world economy.

Where are the comparable Pennsylvania tax credits for the solar energy industry? The production, installation and maintenance of solar panels and related equipment

ment have the potential to support a robust economy in which small businesses thrive.



lately discussing the case due to a long-standing court-imposed gag order.

They walked out of the courtroom smiling.

Selenski did not seem to share Centini's concerns.

"I'll be ready," Selenski said as

he was escorted by sheriff deputies from the courthouse. "She's (Centini) OK. She's not happy about it. She is more ready than all the other attorneys I've had put together. She's ready to go."

Selenski has been represented by eight different attorneys since the bodies of Michael Kerkowski and Tammy Fassett were uncovered in a shallow grave outside a Kingston Township house where Selenski lived on June 5, 2003.

Selenski has often quarreled with his former court-appointed attorneys.

More than 8 1/2 years will have passed since the bodies were found to the trial date of Sept. 10.

Selenski was charged in the killings of Kerkowski and Fassett on May 16, 2006, which equates to 2,309 days from when he was charged to when the trial will begin.

"What cannot be ignored, judge, is the fact that this case has been pending for six years,"

Ferentino said. "Mr. Selenski has been afforded eight different competent lawyers and at one point he represented himself."

Ferentino said prosecutors had "serious concerns regarding the age of the case," noting several witnesses have died, another witness, Paul Weakley, was attacked several times in federal prison, and most recently, investigators discovered a murder plot by a former Selenski cellmate to kill Weakley.

Kerkowski's father, Michael Kerkowski, died in September 2006, and Brett Fry, a former Selenski cellmate, passed away several years ago. Two other witnesses, Ernest Culp and Rodney Samson, are in poor health, prosecutors said.

"A further delay in this case will be a great risk to our witnesses. We're playing Russian roulette," Ferentino said.

Centini said there is an enormous volume of evidence that

needs to be reviewed, experts need to be hired to review physical evidence and with the resignation of Lampman the tasks fall upon herself and Rymza.

"I can't be competent, I can't be effective if the trial is not moved," Centini said. "I've been working non-stop on this case, our entire team has. I cannot work any harder on this case."

### Ideas for Plainsville

Plains Township Fire Capt. Charles Krommes said ideas are surfacing for space from an expected 25 buyouts in the township, most in the Plainsville section.

Recreational fields, trails, a campground and boat launch are among the most popular suggestions, he said.

The township also may carve out an area along the Susquehanna that can be rented for events to help recoup some of the township's costs to maintain the added property, Krommes said. The land may be used for car shows, music festivals and farmers markets featuring produce from nearby fields, he said.

One plot of township land secured from buyouts in the late '80s or early '90s is used for soccer, he said. The soccer organization's portable toilet and soccer nets are removed before flooding. Temporary stages would be permitted on buyout property, he said.

Krommes plans more discussion on the vacant land at future meetings of Valley United, a group focusing on long-term flood recovery that includes representatives of the Federal Emergency Management Agency and several impacted communities.

"I think they're all going to put their heads together and generate ideas and figure out which options work best in their communities," said county Flood

### Funding for buyouts

Brozena expects funding for at least 163 residential properties in eight municipalities that are receiving technical assistance from the authority, including Plains and Jenkins townships.

More second-round buyouts may follow if funding is left, he said.

Plymouth Township is pockmarked with 17 empty lots from prior buyouts and seven more pending from buyouts in the works before the September flood, said township Supervisor Gale Conrad.

Property owners tore down four more, and another seven buyouts are expected to be finalized this fall.

The lots are scattered, and few, if any, provide enough space for large-scale public recreational use, Conrad said.

"Right now, we're just thankful we're getting more of our folks out of harm's way and into an area that doesn't flood," Conrad said.

At least 26 buyouts are expected in Conyngham Township – all in the Mocanaqua section.

Township officials have informally discussed the possibility of a seasonal campground, though

the remaining Mocanaqua residents may come up with other ideas, said township Supervisor Ed Whitebread.

"We don't need any more playgrounds. Whatever is decided, we'll have to maintain it," Whitebread said.

### Garden in Shickshinny?

Shickshinny residents and officials have tossed around many possible uses for at least 25 lots slated for buyout, including a community garden, camping area and athletic fields, said borough Secretary/Treasurer Melissa Weber.

Borough officials also plan to

approach Northwest Area School District officials so see if they are interested in leasing space for sports teams to practice and play, Weber said.

Someone may be interested in using some of the land for horseback lessons and/or riding, she said.

"Right now, the major concern is how we're going to maintain the additional land with existing staff and resources," Weber said.

Community need and the configuration of the plots will drive options for future use, she said.

"It's like a little puzzle," she said.

Despite the maintenance challenges for their municipalities, Weber, Conrad and other municipal representatives encourage property owners to take advantage of the upcoming buyout offers. Property owners will be offered an appraised value.

"I hope they remember what they went through during a flood and locate in a better situated place where they're literally high and dry," Conrad said.

Cernera said he won't look back, because he's been trying to get a buyout for years. He's scheduled to meet with Brozena today to discuss some of the details of his buyout.

His property had 9 feet of water on the first floor in September, compared to 4 feet in the prior record 1972 flood.

He and his wife, Marion, used \$38,000 in flood insurance money to gut and renovate the structure and replace appliances, but they can't relax.

"It will come again," he said. "My wife is still a nervous wreck."

## Service members can march in uniform in gay pride parade

CAMP PENDLETON, Calif. — The Defense Department on Thursday announced it is allowing service members to march in uniform in a gay pride parade for the first time in U.S. history.

In a memorandum sent to all its branches, the department said it was making the allowance for San Diego's gay pride parade on Saturday even though its policy generally bars troops from marching in uniform in parades.

The Defense Department said it did so because organizers had encouraged military personnel to march in their uniform and the event was getting national attention.

The move came only weeks after the Pentagon joined the rest of the U.S. government for the first time in marking June as gay pride month and made an official salute to gay and lesbian service

members.

Defense Secretary Leon Panetta vowed in a video message to remove as many barriers as possible to making the military a model of equal opportunity and said gays and lesbians can be proud in uniform with the repeal last year of the "Don't Ask, Don't Tell" law.

## Saban: Tax PSU tickets to help kids

Alabama coach says punishment should have a positive result.

HOOVER, Ala. — Nick Saban said one option to address the Penn State tragedy might be a ticket tax on athletic events and giving the proceeds to child abuse funds.

The Alabama coach said the priority should be the same as in disciplining a player: Try to produce some good from a negative situation.

Longtime Penn State assistant football coach Jerry Sandusky was convicted last month of sexually abusing 10 boys, sometimes on campus.

"This is a very, very criminal situation that probably reflects poorly on a lot of folks," Saban told a small group of reporters before speaking at Southeastern Conference media days. "It's probably too almost raw to really have a feeling that I can express. I think that what we all should probably be thinking a little bit more about is what do we want to be the outcome of this? Something that's a win-win type thing, for kids in the future, the people that are there now, the players that are there now."

"Maybe they ought to tax all the tickets that they sell on athletics and give the proceeds to some child abuse organization. Or something like that, rather than worrying about some punishment that is really going to have no positive affect on anything."

# Walk in the park has Scott in lead

LYTHAM ST. ANNES, England — Unlike the guys in charge of the weather forecast, Adam Scott got everything just about right Thursday in the British Open.

Scott was determined not to take himself out of contention in the opening round at Royal Lytham & St. Annes, as he had done in the first two majors this year. Caddie Steve Williams gave him a pep talk to play the first hole like it was the last one. Even more inspiration came from the in-

ternational flags posted above the massive grandstand down the left side of the first tee.

They weren't flapping. They were sagging.

In surprisingly calm conditions, Scott raced out to the lead and almost into the record book. He stood on the 18th tee needing a birdie to break the major championship scoring record, and instead made bogey to settle for a 6-under 64.

It matched the lowest Open round ever at Royal Lytham and gave the Australian a one-shot lead over Paul Lawrie, Zach Johnson and Nicolas Colsaerts.

"It was just like a nice walk in the park today," Scott said. "And it was not what we've experienced in the practice rounds. I'm sure there's going to be some weather elements thrown at us the next three days, so just going to have to knock down to handle that. But I'm confident. My ball striking is good. I think I can get it around no matter what the conditions are."

The proof was in limp flags and red numbers on the scoreboards.

Scott was among three dozen players with rounds in the 60s, a group that in-

cluded Tiger Woods. Trying to end a four-year drought in the majors, Woods raced out to four birdies in seven holes to take the early lead, only to settle into a series of pars and one adventure through grass up to his knees for a lone bogey that gave him a 67. In his third Open at Lytham, Woods said it was as easy as he had ever seen it play.

"The wind wasn't blowing, and we're backing golf balls," Woods said. "That's something we just don't see."

Lawrie won his British Open in nasty conditions at Carnoustie in 1999, and the Scot showed he could handle the calm weather with equal aplomb. He ran

## H.S. coach fabricating sex abuse is arrested

Fired Lansdale Catholic coach made anonymous claims against his counterparts.

Tim Udinski was livid.

After one season as head lacrosse coach at Lansdale Catholic High School, he was out, ostensibly after conflicts with players and an assistant.

Udinski thought his dismissal was unfair, one the school wouldn't have considered for counterparts like veteran football coach Jim Algeo. So he launched a scheme to prove the point, authorities say.

Over seven months, Udinski allegedly sent anonymous e-mails to the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, claiming Algeo had solicited sex from a player and accusing the new lacrosse coach of sex assaults.

On Tuesday, Montgomery County prosecutors charged Udinski with harassment and stalking.

District Attorney Risa Vetri Ferman said his offenses were particularly galling because Udinski tried to manipulate a national spotlight on child-sex abuse in a vengeful bid to destroy reputations.

Detectives spent 184 hours on the case, interviewing students and staff and chasing the false rumors.

"The current publicity, it raises awareness, and that is a wonderful thing," Ferman said. "But the downside is that when accusations like this are made, they do so much damage. How do you undo that? How do you unring that bell?"

Udinski, 43, a Doylestown resident with years of coaching youth lacrosse around the region, confessed when confronted last month by detectives, according to an affidavit.

"I was mad at the school for the way I was treated. I was just furious," Udinski told them, the filing said.

The seeds of the plot may have been sown in March 2011, when Udinski himself was the target of false allegations. According to the affidavit, the parent of a Lansdale Catholic lacrosse player filed an anonymous complaint accusing Udinski of throwing a player to the ground and hitting another with a stick.

School officials suspended Udinski while they investigated. Ultimately, they deemed the claim unfounded and reinstated him as coach, according to the affidavit from Detective Drew A. Marino.

But conflicts within the team —

## Swoyersville wins on 7th inning triple

SWOYERSVILLE — In three at-bats on Thursday, Swoyersville's Joey Gavenonis didn't take the bat off his shoulder drawing three walks.

Then in his fourth plate appearance, he only needed to see one pitch. And boy, did it count.

Gavenonis, a rising sophomore at Wyomissing Valley West, crushed a first-pitch fastball with two outs in the bottom of the seventh to dead center at Roosevelt Field for a walk-off three-run triple to lead Swoyersville to the Wyoming Valley American Legion Junior League championship with a 5-4 win over Nanticoke.

"I just saw it keep flying and I didn't know what to do," Gavenonis said. "I saw it fly and thought 'oh it might be a home run' but doing that, a walk-off is insane right now. I can't believe I just

did that."

Both teams advance to the regional tournament. Swoyersville will play in the Kutztown event, while Nanticoke participates in the regional at Freemansburg.

Swoyersville, which has been a dominant force in the league for the last handful of years, including a state championship in 2010, still has some magic.

"We had that feeling for the last four years that we're the team to beat around here," Swoyersville manager Bob Aten said. "We build our program. We go and play the best teams around the state in the regular season and it pays off in these types of games."

Nanticoke was on the verge of winning the league title, taking a 4-2 lead into the bottom of the seventh. Pinch-hitter Jason Wall led off the inning for Swoyersville reaching safely on an

error. A walk to Justin Montalvo put runners on first and second.

But Nanticoke's John Wickiser settled down after that to get the next two hitters out. A walk to Logan Zavada then loaded the bases to set the stage for Gavenonis, who was looking for a fastball and got it.

"You have the bases loaded, you know the pitcher wants to get the batter out so we told him go up and look for that first fastball and he drilled it," Aten noted. "That's what it's all about, somebody step up and get a big hit and Joey definitely did that for us."

A three-run inning of its own gave Nanticoke a 4-2 lead after six. There was controversy in the inning as Christian Pack scored after initially being called out at the plate. But he was

## Wiggins says race is 'pretty much over'

With high mountains behind him, Tour leader should pull into Paris as champion.

BAGNERES-DE-LUCHON, France — Britain's Bradley Wiggins overcame the mountains and challengers to retain the yellow jersey, while Spain's Alejandro Valverde won the 17th stage of the Tour de France on Thurs-

day.

After the last hard ascent, Bradley maintained his overall lead and said he sensed "that it was pretty much over" with just three racing days left. He's trying to become the first Briton to win cycling's biggest race.

Wiggins faces one last test — the individual time trial, his specialty — on Saturday.

Flat stages await Wiggins on Friday and Sunday, which features the ride to the finish on the Champs-Elysees in Paris. Those

stages aren't expected to alter the standings.

He appears on pace to make some history: Wiggins would become the first Olympic track champion to become a Tour winner. He took the yellow jersey in Stage 7, and hasn't let go of it since.

No rider has done that since France's Bernard Hinault held a lead from the same stage in 1981 all the way to the finish.

An 89-mile ride from the



**Quieterriua Gross****GAR**



## It's two for the show

It was a golden weekend for the Wyoming Valley Conference.

It's not often that the WVC leaves the PIAA Championships with two individual state championships.

Coughlin's Dannah Hayward's and Hazleton Area's Julia Franzosa's gold-medal performances in Shippensburg earn them The Times Leader Girls Track and Field Co-Players of the Year award.

For both seniors, the award – as well as the elusive state medal – is an accumulation of four years of hard work on the track and in field.

**Dannah Hayward**

Hayward wants to make one thing clear – she is not following in any one's footsteps.

For the first three years, Hayward hid behind former Coughlin three-time state champion Shelley Black's limelight in the hurdle events. When Black left the Crusaders for a track scholarship at Penn State, many unfairly compared Hayward to her mentor.


"It was frustrating," Hayward said. "People would say I should run fast like Shelley, but that's unfair. She's not me, and I'm not her. Now my name is right next to her on the state championship banner at Coughlin, and it's gratifying to see that I conquered that feat on my own terms."

Hayward did something Black could not do – win a state championship in the 300 hurdles in her senior year. She posted a 43.37-second finish, and claimed her second PIAA medal.

"That's what I worked for since seventh grade," she said. "Everything I've done was towards that. It meant the world to me. I'm still in shock. It still hasn't sunk in. It's relieving that it was all able to work out so well. My hard work paid off."

It was the run of a lifetime, and put her in a position that she could only dream of. With intentions of attending St. Joseph's as a walk-on track recruit, her championship-winning run provided her with a scholarship opportunity and a place on the team's roster.

Hawks' coach Kevin Quinn had never seen Hayward run prior to Shippensburg. He was so blown away by her performance that he convinced the team's men's coach to transfer the remaining \$15,000 in his budget to Hayward for a partial scholarship for her freshman year.

ampionships with gold on her mind.

After coming up short early on in the year and finishing 19th at states during her junior year, she was just hoping to medal in her last event as a Cougar.

"In the beginning, I would've probably said there was no way that I was going to even medal," she said. "As the season went on, I thought a medal was possible. I was only seeded fifth coming in, so I didn't think I was in a position to win."

"It was a lot of hard work," Otterbine said. "She made her goal two years ago to medal at states. She devoted countless hours of work in the field, and it paid off for her in the end. This means a lot to this program to have this on our belt."

southwestern town of Bagneres-de-Luchon to the ski station of Peyragudes on Thursday featured three hefty ascents in the Pyrenees and an uphill finish.

Valverde, the Movistar leader who returned from a two-year doping ban this year, won his third Tour stage in a breakaway. Christopher Froome of Britain was second, and Wiggins was third, both 19 seconds back.

Overall, Wiggins leads Sky teammate Froome in second by 2 minutes, 5 seconds, and Italy's Vincenzo Nibali trails in third, 2:41 back, after losing 18 seconds to them in the final ascent.

A 2-minute lead after nearly 80 hours of racing and 2 1/2 weeks might not seem like much of a margin. But in stage races like the Tour, the strategy of success for a leader is keying on his closest rivals.

Wiggins wasn't much worried about any other riders. After Nibali and Froome, his next closest challenger was Jurgen Van Den Broeck, who was 5:46 back, a deficit almost impossible to erase without a collapse by Wiggins.

Defending champion Cadel Evans of Australia, after dropping out of contention in the first Pyrenean day on Wednesday, lost

more time and trailed by 9:57. Still, he rose to sixth overall, after Spain's Haimer Zubeldia lost nearly a minute to the Australian.

American Tejay Van Garderen — a BMC teammate of Evans — rose a notch to fifth, and was 8:30 back.

Valverde, with tears in his eyes in the winner's circle, had a rough start to the Tour with at least three crashes. He also sensed Wiggins and Froome closing on him at the end of the stage.

"I went all out," said Valverde, who also won stages in the Tour Down Under and the Paris-Nice races this year. "When I saw there were only 700 meters left, I was really really happy."

One of Sky's dilemmas was exposed on Thursday: Froome entered the day clinging to an 18-second lead over Nibali, and he was looking for any chance to gain time on the Italian.

On the final ascent to the Peyragudes, Froome tried to gain time on Nibali, but also repeatedly spoke with Wiggins and even gestured with his hand for the Sky leader to come along.

"Chris encouraged me, saying 'Come on, come on,'" Wiggins said. "He's really strong ... he can win the Tour one day."

The fog-shrouded stage in the Pyrenees led the peloton, depleted by crashes and sickness, over three big climbs. Those included the Port de Bales, one of cycling's hardest, and two lesser ones.

The Alabama coach didn't go into details of how a tax would be implemented. He stressed his comments had to do more with philosophy than a real recommendation.

"I probably shouldn't have said that. I'm just a regular old coach," Saban said. "I worry about what they do on third down. A lot of times we do the same thing with players. Everybody's always worried about what's the punishment? The way I try to always look at it is, what's the outcome? What outcome do we want? Sometimes I even say that to the player, what outcome do you want? Do you want to graduate from school? Do you want to play in the NFL some day? If that's the outcome that you want, this behavior is not becoming of that. So what do we need to do to make it better?"

A report said university officials, including former football coach Joe Paterno, concealed

child sex abuse allegations against Sandusky more than a decade ago to avoid bad publicity.

Saban, who has led the Crimson Tide to two national titles in the past three seasons, also said any perception that football coaches wield too much power doesn't apply at Alabama. Saban, however, has been described as the most powerful man in sports.

He also said he has faith that Alabama tries "to promote the moral obligation that we all have to protect other folks."

off three birdies over the last five holes. Johnson, who won the 2006 Masters in the wind and cold at Augusta National, flirted with a major record-tying 63 until a bogey on the 17th hole. Colaerts, the big hitter from Belgium, holed out with an 8-iron on the 481-yard second hole for eagle and added four birdies for his 65.

Brandt Snedeker was another shot behind at 66.

"We had a little wind early on the front nine, but it kind of calmed down the second half," Snedeker said. "That's the best Americans are going to see over here."

Rory McIlroy was panned last summer at Royal St. George's for saying he prefers calm conditions, so maybe this was more to his liking. He wound up in the group at 67 after a wild day filled with great shots, bad luck and a bump on the head for a 16-year-old spectator standing in the wrong spot.

McIlroy was at 3 under with four holes remaining when his drive on the 15th hole sailed to the right of the fairway. It plunked the teenager in the head and caromed farther to the right. The teen was OK. The ball settled a few inches beyond the out-of-bounds stakes near a corporate tent, sending McIlroy back to the tee to play his third shot. McIlroy gave the lad a glove on which he wrote "Sorry" with a frown face and "Rory."

"He could have headed it the other way," McIlroy joked later. "It would have been on the fairway."

He bounced back from that double bogey by driving the 336-yard 16th hole and two-putting for birdie, then making birdie on the final hole to join guys like Ernie Els, Masters champion Bubba Watson, Graeme McDowell and Steve Stricker, who followed an eagle from the 13th fairway with a double bogey on the next hole.

One sign of the easy scoring was that no one shot in the 80s. That hasn't happened in the opening round of the British Open since 1998 at Royal Birkdale, where conditions also were benign. Woods opened with a 65 that year, only to get blown away in bad weather the next round.

Perhaps bad weather is on the way. The forecast hasn't been nearly as accurate as Scott was with his tee shots on Thursday — sunshine when it calls for rain, clouds when the forecast is for dry spells.

Els and his caddie, Ricci Roberts, figured out immediately that dead calm translates to low scores.

"It's on today," he said. "I said to Ricci, 'I might not have the chance again.' You never know how the weather is going to be."

But even in such weather suited for low scores, Lytham still required tee shots in the fairway. It still demanded good shots. And it was a struggle for some.

Lee Westwood, despite a birdie-birdie start, hit a bunker shot across the third green to take double bogey, and had to play a left-handed shot out of the back end of a pot bunker on the 13th hole as he staggered to a 73. Luke Donald made a sloppy bogey — his only one of the round — on the final hole for a 70. Justin Rose played in the same group as Woods and already was nine shots behind after eight holes. He rallied for a 74.

Lytham was there for the taking — as long as the tee shots found the fairway.

Phil Mickelson, a runner-up at Royal St. George's last year, went from the left rough to the right rough on the par-5 seventh to make double bogey on the easy hole at Lytham. On the next hole, he tried to hit wedge out of a pot bunker and it got snagged in high grass just over the lip. A small search party nearly didn't find it, and Mickelson had to take a penalty shot to drop it back in the fairway.

"I putted poorly today and I drove it horrific and the chipping was below average," he said.

Scott had no such issues. After an early bogey when he got out of position on the third hole, he warmed up with birdies on the sixth and seventh holes, and then ran off three straight birdies on the back nine, starting with the 598-yard 11th hole that he reaced in two shots.

# Good start not good enough for Tiger

LYTHAM ST. ANNES, England — Tiger Woods hit every tee shot exactly where he was looking, needed only eight putts through seven holes and reached 4-under par to quickly get his name atop the leaderboard Thursday in the British Open.

It looked like he was just getting started.

Instead, he stalled. On as easy a day as Royal Lytham & St. Annes can provide — soft fairways and greens, little evidence of wind — Woods had to settle for a 3-under 67 that left him three shots behind Adam Scott.

Woods looked like he was capable of running away from the field with those four early birdies to take the lead. He narrowly missed a 10-foot birdie putt on the par-3 ninth hole for a 29, which would have been his low-

est nine-hole start in any major.

"We knew that we needed at least to get off to a quick start on that front nine, and I figured a couple under would have been good," Woods said. "But I look up on the board and Scotty is going pretty low, and so is everyone else. I felt I had to make a few more, and I was able to."

He covered the flag with his tee shot on the par-3 12th hole, leaving himself 12 feet below the hole. But when he walked onto the green, he saw a leaderboard packed with names. His was not at the top, rather somewhere in the middle.

Scott already was at 6 under and challenging the major championship record of 63. Bubba Watson, Graeme McDowell and Zach Johnson, all of them major champions, also were at 4 under with plenty of birdie holes ahead of them.

Perhaps it was just a coinci-

dence, but what followed was Woods' worst putt of the round.

That's when Woods shifted into neutral. He gave himself reasonable chances, and kept leaving putts short.

"I was just lacking a little bit of pace on the greens coming home," he said.

One of the best shots he hit all day kept was on the only hole where he failed to make par — and it saved him from a much higher score.

Woods worked out a game plan that looked similar to what he used at Hoylake five years ago when he last won the British Open. He rarely hit driver off the tee in an effort to avoid bunkers, only this was different. Royal Lytham's bunkers are staggered in the fairway, and they are everywhere. Woods didn't just stay short of them, he navigated his way expertly through them.

He hit a driver on No. 2 and a

5-wood on No. 10 that started left and over the heads of the spectators, only to curve gently back to the right and into a perfect spot.
