





FUNDAMENTAL BAPTIST CHURCH

Fundamental Baptist Church has grown a lot since its founding in 1962, and this November it will take its biggest step yet.

This next month the independent Baptist church on Saint John's west side will leave its home of 34 years and move into a new building at 1170 Sand Cove Road.

It'll be a big change. Space was getting tight at the church's old home on the corner of Danells and Bleury streets, and seniors were finding the building's stairways a challenge. Senior pastor Herb Hunter says that was one big improvement in the new building's design.

"It's all one level, which is an exciting feature, given the number of stairs used to enter this current facility," he says.

The new building's 18,000 square feet of floor space will come in handy for the church's ministries, especially for the church's popular Friday night Kids 4 Truth ministry, which combines Bible teaching with a lot of noisy games.

"The activity space in the fellowship hall will help for sure, because it's quite cramped right now and it gets quite loud," says Hunter. "It should enable us to grow to fit the space, whereas now we couldn't really grow beyond the space we had."

Besides the fellowship hall, the church's foyer has grown, giving churchgoers more space to chat after service; the main auditorium is larger, enabling the church to host more visitors to regular services as well as programs such as its annual Christmas cantata; Sunday school rooms are larger and the kitchen is much larger, enabling the church to host more dinner functions - in recent years the church has had to move some of its annual banquets off-site due to space constraints.

Beside the increase in space, there's another exciting new feature with the new

building - it's environmentally friendly. The church will be heated by a geothermal system and low-wattage bulbs were used where possible. Many interior lights are on motion-sensor switches, to ensure they aren't left on, wasting energy.

Pastor Hunter says that while the church has only been working on plans for the new building in earnest since about 2006, the idea has been in the background since the mid-1990's. The contractor's bid on the new facility was just under \$2.5 million, and construction started last fall.

"Amazingly enough, after a year's worth of building and everything that's gone on, we should be within 10 per cent of what we budgeted to do it," Hunter says. He adds that he's not worried about the building's high price tag.

"People in the church have really stepped up and there's been a lot of giving going on, so we should be able to meet our financial obligations," he says. "I just try to take the perspective that we entered into this project believing that it was something God wanted us to do."

While all the church's members are eagerly watching the new building's progress, one member in particular has a unique perspective.

Victor Burrill helped found the Fundamental Baptist Church in 1962, while he was pastoring churches in Dipper Harbour, Chance Harbour, and Lepreau. He helped the original members with their first meetings in homes, although his workload left him unable to pastor the church full-time. He recommended the church's first pastor, Douglas Fraser to them, and credits the church's growth over the years to sound Bible teaching that was started by Fraser and carried on by other pastors like Paul Fosmark.

But back in 1962, when he helped found the fledgling work in what was then known as Lancaster, Burrill had no idea just how much the church would grow.

"I never dreamed we were going to be in a facility like we are now," he says.
